René Leemans, Amsterdam, the Netherlands), *Personalizing Care for Head and Neck Cancer* (Carol Bradford, Ann Arbor, USA), *The Creation of Vascularized Tracheal Transplant* (Vincent Vander Poorten, guest, Leuven, Belgium), *Bioactive Glass for Reconstruction in Otolaryngology – Head and Neck Surgery* (Reidar Grénman, Turku, Finland), *A Patient Centred Approach to Vocal Rehabilitation: Prioritising the Merits of Physical Voice Therapy, Psychological Therapy and Surgery* (Janet Wilson, Newcastle upon Tyne, United Kingdom).
